Koji Nakamura is a master Taiko drummer and teacher over 25 years, from Shiga, Japan. His recording with Paul Winter, CRESTONE, won a Grammy in 2008. Yukiko Matsuyama is a 2010 Grammy winner and international recording artist. She plays contemporary and classical music on the traditional Japanese koto.
